<p>10. This is a letter describing the activities immediately before the Battle of Port Republic. It was written by Private Alfred Aurandt, of Co. "E" (84th PVI). Aurandt served throughout the war, and was eventually mustered out with the 57th Pennsylvania.</p> <p>Dear Mother</p> <p>it is with great pleasure that i again take my pen to inform you that i am well at this present time and i hope that these few lines may find you all enjoying the same good health. Will Stewart is well and the rest of the folks is well at this present time. Aaron Hewit and Jonathan Aurandt is here. they are both getting along write well. i did not expect to see them here. there is a great many here that i know. they say that there is a hundred and seventy five thousand troops here and genl Banks is coming with about forty thousand and genl Blenmker and rosenkrans is not far of with a large force. they are expecting an awful slaughter handy here some of these days soon. genl Mclennen is within 8 miles of richmond and when he commences on we will commence here and we will have to fight our way through to richmond. there is a great many rebels between this and richmond. they are within six miles of here. we drove Jackson and all the rest of the rebels ahead of us till here. i think that if we win this battle it will stop the war. there will be apt to be a big force on each side. i will give you better satesfaction about the war the next time. nothing more at present but remains your true and affectionate son Alfred Aurandt to Margaret Aurandt Yellow Springs Blair County Pa.</p> <p>Address Alfred Aurandt Comp'y E. 84th Regt P.V.
